
At the Reflections '93 Banquet, Susan was presented with a certificate and a pen set. Congratulation Susan and our sincere thanks for your involvement with the Association.

A) GENERALMEETING:

The purpose of this short preliminary General Meeting was to amend Ottawa Regional Branch / Section régionale d'Ottawa Constitution, ByLaw 9b (Definitions of Quorum).

At present, ByLaw 9b states: "At any meeting of the Branch, there shall be a quorum of no less than ten (10) of the full members present, and in good standing".

Sylvie Bertrand moved that ByLaw 9b be changed to read: "At any meeting of the Branch, there shall be a quorum of no less than seven (7) of the full members present, and in good standing".

Seconded by Carol Moher.

At 7:45 p.m. Danielle Amat welcomed everyone to ORB/SRO's 1993 Annual General Meeting.

Treasurer: Diana Brown requested that her 1992 Financial Statement be accepted. Seconded by Susan Bourdeau.

Questions RE: Financial Statement:

Regional Award - Diana described the nature of the Regional Award and the cost.

Canada Post - Diana explained that the "Canada Post charge referred to the rental of the Mailbox.

Reflections '93 - Danielle Amat cleared up the confusion regarding the Reflections'93 start-up costs that were reimbursed to the Region.

The Financial Report Passed.

3. New Business:

a) Reflections'93:

Danielle mentioned that the Official Financial Report was not available since the books had not yet closed. The Regional share from the Conference should work out to approx. \$3,000.00.

For those were not aware, we reported that one of our Workshop Leaders, Mrs. Marjorie Mann passed away in early September. On May 13th, she had presented an extremely enjoyable seminar on "Laughter As A Stress Releaser". She will be missed.

Pat Graham asked how many were in attendance at Reflections '93. Diana Brown placed the final total at an estimated 135 delegates. Danielle thanked everyone for their hard work. The Conference was a great success.



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b) Membership:

Diana Brown reported that we had over 30 members who payed their 1993 Registration. More were coming in every day.

c) Director's Report:

Susan reported that she attended the first Board of Director's Meeting on October 2nd.

Mike Mortimer has replaced Marsha Hunt as Public Relations Co-ordinator.

William Land's letter commenting on some of the deficiencies he found in the organization of Reflections '93 was discussed. He was particularly concerned about the length of the Conference. Five days was too long. Most of the remaining feedback from the delegates was very positive.

The bilingual content of our provincial newsletter is still a concern. Members should be encouraged to submit more articles in French. If we let it slide, most publications from OALT/ABO will remain unilingual english.

d) Elections:

Pat Graham was asked to monitor the 1993 Regional Executive Elections.

PRESIDENT: Danielle Amat said that she would stand for another term as President. There being no further nominations, DANIELLE AMAT WAS ACCLAIMED AS PRESIDENT.

VICE-PRESIDENT: In Claudine Guenette's absence, Danielle Amat reported that Claudine did not wish to renew her term as Vice-President. With no nominations from the "floor", we went on to TREASURER.

TREASURER: Diana Brown said that she would like to stand again as Treasurer. There being no further nominations, DIANA BROWN WAS ACCLAIMED AS TREASURER.

SECRETARY: Since there was no Secretary during the 1992-93 Term, Danielle Amat nominated Carol Moher. Seconded by Diana Brown. Carol accepted. There being no further nominations, CAROL MOHER WAS ACCLAIMED ASSECRETARY.

DIRECTOR: Susan Bourdeau said that she would stand for another term as Director. There being no further nominations, SUSAN BOURDEAU WAS ACCLAIMED AS DIRECTOR.

Director's report

Thursday September 23, 1993

This was a very busy year, with Ottawa hosting the 20th Annual Conference. As Co-chairperson and director of the region, I was very involved in both activities. I am very glad the year is over.

There were 2 teleconferences, 2 on site meetings and 1 brainstorming held.

Some things discussed and decided on were:

The regions are to discuss adding a new category for retired and unemployed members.

The membership database will be handled by Theresa Kennedy, who is also the Provincial Treasurer.

A revised membership form was discussed. It will be in both official languages with the regional map and membership definitions on the reverse. The three part form will no longer be used and each region will have to photocopy the form.

We now have a bibliography on Library Technicians compiled by Marsha Hunt (Public Relations)

The Constitution need to be updated and a committee was set up to look into what is needed to changed. By next year, we should have a new draft of the updated version.

The Political Awareness Committee led by Ronn Chenney is now finsihed. Genetric job descritions of each field (School, Government, Special, Public) are available.

One problem Ottawa did have with the Provincial, was with the use of French. As is stated in our history, we are the only fully bilingual association in Canada, and our constitution states that all official documents must be translated. However, this has not been the case for a few years. As a majority of our membership is English, we allowed this rule to slide. But this year, with the conference in Ottawa, we asked to have all official reports translated. There was a complaint that it too expensive and



no one really care if it wasn't translated. It was stated that when any requests came in, none were in French and that no articles were submitted to the newsletter in French. So why should the Provincial spend all that money. It was said that the Ottawa conference would not make any money to help the Provincial coiffers.

So next year, please, please submit any and every thing you can in French (bilingual) on or about library technicians. Write any article, send letters, requests. Don't allow the rest of regions turn this association into a "English only" association.

We now have a new Provincial Executives. Suzanne Orlando - President. Barbara Cope - Vice President. Penni Lee - Secretary. Theresa Kenneday - Treasurer. Mike Mortimer - Public Relations. Brady Leyser - Newsletter Editor.

The first meeting of the new year is October 2, 1993.

I attended the first Board meeting of the year on October 2, 1993 in Toronto. There were many new faces.

The primary topic should have been the budget but unfortunately the Treasurer was unable to attend and the report which was to be couriered to the president did not arrive. It will be discussed at the next meeting.

We have a new provincial newsletter editor - Brady Leyser (TALTA). He is going to change the format of the newsletter. It will be 8-1/2 X ll", 8 pages, 2 colours and can include up to four pictures. He also suggested that we run a contest to pick a new name for the newsletter. A prize would be given. The deadline for entries will be Feb. 5, 1994.

The first issue will be out by late autumn, which will be mostly a conference issue. Deadlines for future issues will be given then. These deadlines are to be strictly adherred to. When submitting articles, please send both a paper copy and a disk, clearly marked as to what software program was used. I urge everyone to try to submit anything they think might be of interest to the association (e.g. a letter to the editor, a funny cartoon ...).

We also have a new Public Relations Co-ordinator - Mike Mortimer. He seems quite keen and interested in promoting the association.

We are also looking into making constitutional revisions. Our provincial constitution is long out of date. Please refer to the newsletter for the changes that are being discussed. Comments are welcome. Please send any

correspondance to me.

Translation is a major concern of Ottawa's and it is now being addressed by the Board of Directors. Even though translation is expensive, we believe that some documents must be in both languages. The Board would like to be specific on what we do and do not translate. Items that should be translated are: the membership form, the directory/statement of standards and all annual reports. What else? This is important. As our region is primarily bilingual, we need to be vocal. Please let me know what you think.

We are going to produce a new membership directory this year. We have agreed to go back to the old smaller version.

Halton-Peel are well on their way to a good beginning with next year's conference. "Revolution/Evolution '94" (May 25-29, 1994) will be at Erindale College. They already have some workshops set. For example: Internet, library automation systems, Inmagic, Elegant Librarian, and, How to take apart and put back together a computer. Some personal development workshops and some tours are also being scheduled.

The ABM will be Friday morning. There will be a Tex-Mex barbeque and the Banquet is a Mardi-Gras theme. Members are asked to wear a mask.

They are planning to have a Penny Drive for the United Way at the Conference...so, start saving those pennies!

The next Board Meeting will be November 27 in Toronto. I will let you know how things are going.


